



The SAMRT virtual Annual General Meeting was held Saturday, April 30, with **134** members participating.

Strategic Plan 2020 - 2022

The SAMRT's 3-year plan will conclude this year and work has begun for our **2023 – 2025** plan. Watch your inbox over the summer to participate in a survey to help shape the next strategic plan. In September, an in-person workshop will be held with key stakeholders to gather further input.

Jurisprudence Project

The goal of the project is to develop a jurisprudence program that will educate and assess the knowledge of the members of SAMRT. As regulated health professionals, medical radiation technologists have significant responsibilities. To meet these expectations, members need to understand not only what SAMRT is, but why they exist. Our work is governed by complex laws, legislation, policies and ethics. A jurisprudence program, approved by the SAMRT Council will provide the background and understanding of these laws, regulations, standard and scope of practice and code of ethics that each member must meet. We are currently reviewing proposals from external organizations to develop the program.

Regulation of Sonographers

The Government of Saskatchewan is considering a proposal to amend The Medical Radiation Technologists Act, 2006 (the Act) to allow for the regulation of diagnostic medical sonographers under the Saskatchewan Association of Medical Radiation Technologists (SAMRT). In May, the Ministry of Health launched a consultation process with sonographers and government stakeholders including pan-Canadian and provincial health professional regulators. We are awaiting the results of the consultation, which will inform our next steps.
