Report from Ottawa Meetings - April 2019

President Scott and Executive Director Debbie attended three days of meetings in Ottawa in late April. The CAMRT Annual General Meeting and Governance Forum, the National Network and the Alliance of Medical Radiation and Imaging Technologists Regulators of Canada (the Alliance).

Representatives from the provincial associations, provincial regulators and CAMRT meet to collaborate on areas of common interest and concerns. The CAMRT meetings included a full day of education sessions followed by a Celebration of Excellence Reception with awards and recognition.

Prior to the business portion of the meeting, the National Network members participated in a blanket exercise that teaches the history of indigenous peoples in Canada. Then, following a lengthy consultation process, the Network members formalized the updated Terms of Reference and Memorandum of Understanding. [Click here](#) to view the official signing ceremony.

Karen Morrison, CAMRT presented the results of CAMRT's joint mental health survey with the CSMLS and Sonography Canada. The CAMRT will be releasing the results to MRTs in the coming months. Coinciding with the mental health survey results, our colleagues from Nova Scotia presented on Mental health/building resilience, i.e., what is needed for decision-making and support and prevention.

The final day of meetings wrapped up with the Alliance meeting. The Alliance is a group of provincial regulators, addressing and evolving medical radiation and imaging technologist regulation and regulatory issues to enhance safe, competent, and ethical care for Canadians. This meeting included updates on various ongoing projects, including Labour and Mobility Exams, Internationally Educated MRT assessment framework, and a discussion about the Harry Cayton Report on Inquiry into the College of Dental Surgeons of British Columbia. This long awaited report provides recommendations to the BC government for the wider reform of the framework for health professional regulation in British Columbia. For regulatory bodies across Canada there is

much to be learned from this report, and other provinces are paying close attention.

Report from CAMRT Director Ada Bunko

The AGM was held in Ottawa April 27th and was streamed to members who were not able to make it but wanted to participate. Overall, it was a great success, with active questions and participation from the members. We hope to keep the online streaming option open to all members across Canada.

The CAMRT is proud to have assisted in the development of the five Choosing Wisely Recommendations earlier this year – a result from the collaborative partnership with Choosing Wisely Canada. These recommendations can guide MRTs in reducing procedures that are inappropriate or unnecessary to a patient. Another milestone for the CAMRT is the inclusion of our national journal – the Journal of Medical Imaging and Radiation Sciences (JMIRS) – into the MEDLINE database. This has been the result of years of work from both the CAMRT as well as the JMIRS editorial board. The addition of our journal allows the medical imaging and radiation therapy communities to be raised to a new profile and a certain prestige in the eyes of the world. Congratulations to the JMIRS board!

The Competency Profiles for each of our disciplines has been under review and is now in its final validation process. If you participated in the feedback and review process, the CAMRT thanks you for your hand in its development. We are striving to maintain these profiles and keep them up to date with new and emerging technologies.

Continuing education is also evolving within the CAMRT. Cost effective webinar series and virtual were added to our contingent of quick self-studies, full-length courses, and certificate programs. Please visit www.camrt.ca/professional-development/ for a comprehensive list.

No right is extended to observers to actively participate in meetings and no recording devices or cameras are permitted

The SAMRT meets four times annually, alternating between Regina and Saskatoon. The next two meetings are Friday September 6th (Regina) and November 29th (Saskatoon).

Changes to the SAMRT Bylaws

In May, members received an e-blast notification for amendments to the SAMRT Regulatory, Administrative and Fees Bylaws.

Changes include amendments to the licence categories including the addition of a Retired Membership and amendment of Restricted Licence to Graduate Licence.

Graduate practice licence

14(1) Subject to the other provisions of this section, an initial graduate practice licence or a renewal of a graduate practice licence is available to a person who:

(a) has completed the prescribed education program within the three years prior to the application for the licence; and

(b) meets the requirements for registration as a student member pursuant to clause 9(1)(b) or (c).

Graduate practice licence members must work under direct supervision. The definition of direct supervision can be [viewed here](#).
